

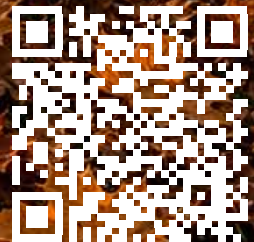

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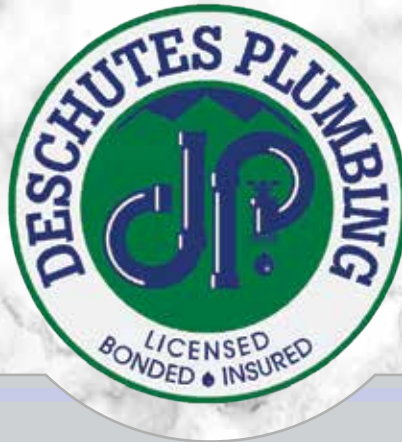

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Ten Commandments for Parents of Athletes

Several years ago, a writer for a foreign athletic publication researched the role of the parent of the young athlete. He talked with young athletes and found that, though parents often present a problem, the youngsters feel anxious to solve it.

They want their parents to be closely involved but without causing either a highly critical or an overprotective environment. It is his opinion that a fundamental requirement for creating a happier situation is the creation of guidelines for both the parents and their athletic children.

1. Make sure your children know that win or lose, scared or heroic, you love them, appreciate their efforts, and are not disappointed in them. This will allow them to do their best without fear of failure. Be the person in their lives that they can look to for constant positive enforcement.

2. Try your best to be completely honest about your child's athletic capability, his/her competitive attitude, sportsmanship, and actual skill level.

3. Be helpful but don't coach them on the way to the field, on the way back, or at breakfast, and so on. It's tough not to, but it's a lot tougher for the athlete to be inundated with advice, pep talks, and often, critical instruction.

4. Teach them to enjoy the thrill of competition, to be "out there trying," to be working to improve their skills and attitudes. Help them to develop the feel for competing, for trying hard, for having fun.

5. Try not to re-live your athletic life through your children in a way that creates pressure—you fumbled too, you lost as well as won. You were frightened, you backed off at times, and you were not always heroic. Don't pressure them because of

your pride. Young athletes need their parents, so you must not withdraw. Just remember, there is a thinking, feeling, sensitive free spirit out there in that uniform who needs a lot of understanding, especially when their world turns bad. If he is comfortable with you—win or lose—they are on their way to maximum achievement and enjoyment.

6. Don't compete with the coach. If the coach becomes an authority figure, it will run from enchantment to disenchantment with your athlete.

7. Don't compare skill, courage, or attitudes of your child with other members of the team, at least within his/her hearing.

8. Get to know the coaches so that you can be assured that their philosophy, attitudes, ethics, and knowledge are such that you are happy to have your child under their leadership.

9. Always remember that people tend to exaggerate both when praised and when criticized. Temper your reaction and investigate before over-reacting.

10. Make a point of understanding courage, and the fact that it is relative. Some of us can climb mountains and are afraid to fight. Some of us will fight, but turn to jelly if a bee approaches.

Everyone is frightened in certain areas. Explain that courage is not the absence of fear, but a means of doing something in spite of fear or discomfort. The job of the parent of an athlete is a tough one, and it takes a lot of effort to do it well.

This team has an opportunity to define what this chapter of the Long Blue Line will look like. The next chapter starts now.



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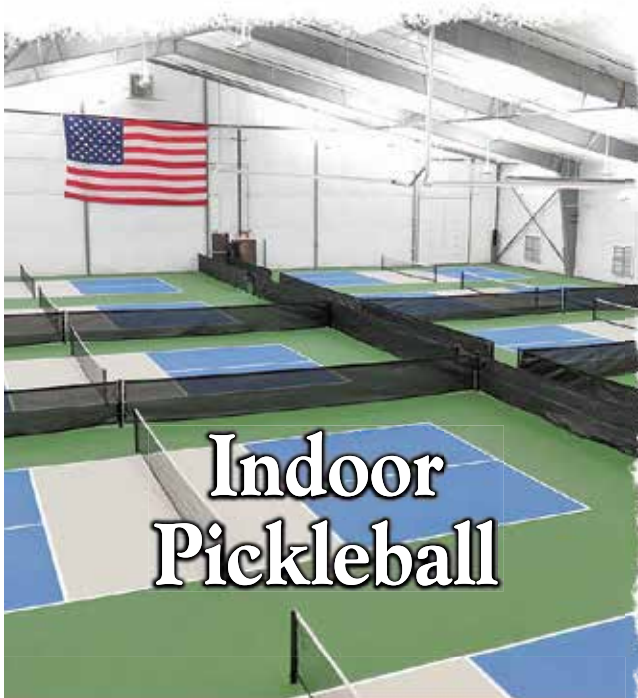
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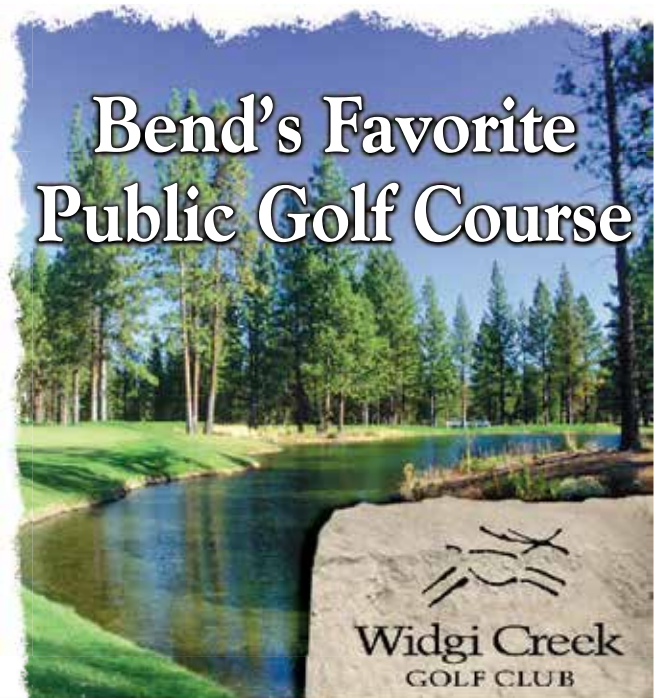

Welcome everyone to another year of Caldea Football, our 6th overall and our 5th Varsity football Season. Like last year, I'd like to begin with gratitude and thankfulness for everyone involved as we truly build this program the right way. I'd first like to thank the Caldera Administration and Athletic Program, Chris Boyd and Ryan Cruz for the opportunity to lead this program. I'd like to thank all of the coaching staff, the parents and the athletes for believing in the culture we are building. Finally, I'd like to thank my wife Kelsey, for taking care of our home and our two little girls.

I have been a part of the Caldera Football Program since its first Varsity Football season in 2022. I coached the Defensive Backs during those years but also ran the entire logistical operation behind the scenes taking on a huge workload as an assistant: Film, Special Teams, JV Head Coach and play caller. My football career started in Southern Oregon, as an '09 graduate of Grants Pass High School where I played football for Tom Blanchard and John Musser. I also want to thank the seniors. This has been a group I've been lucky enough to coach for a full year cycle and it's

been incredible watching each of them grow as football players and young men. While adversity and growth has proved challenging, each of these players have bought into the cultural shift and will provide the example of the standard for the young guys just beginning their journeys as a part of the Wolfpack Football Program.

While I was very grateful to be a part of the prior staff, as I've taken control of the leadership of this program we have initiated a total cultural reset within the program. We lacked an identity, had glaring inefficiencies and we did not prioritize the correct things. Our staff has worked extremely hard this off season and preseason to implement a culture. While it takes time, our call to arms has been "Brick by Brick". This last offseason, we did tremendous work laying more bricks to solidify the foundation of what it means to be a Caldera Football Player.

We have had a busy off-season and have prioritized giving back to the community in an amazing way. 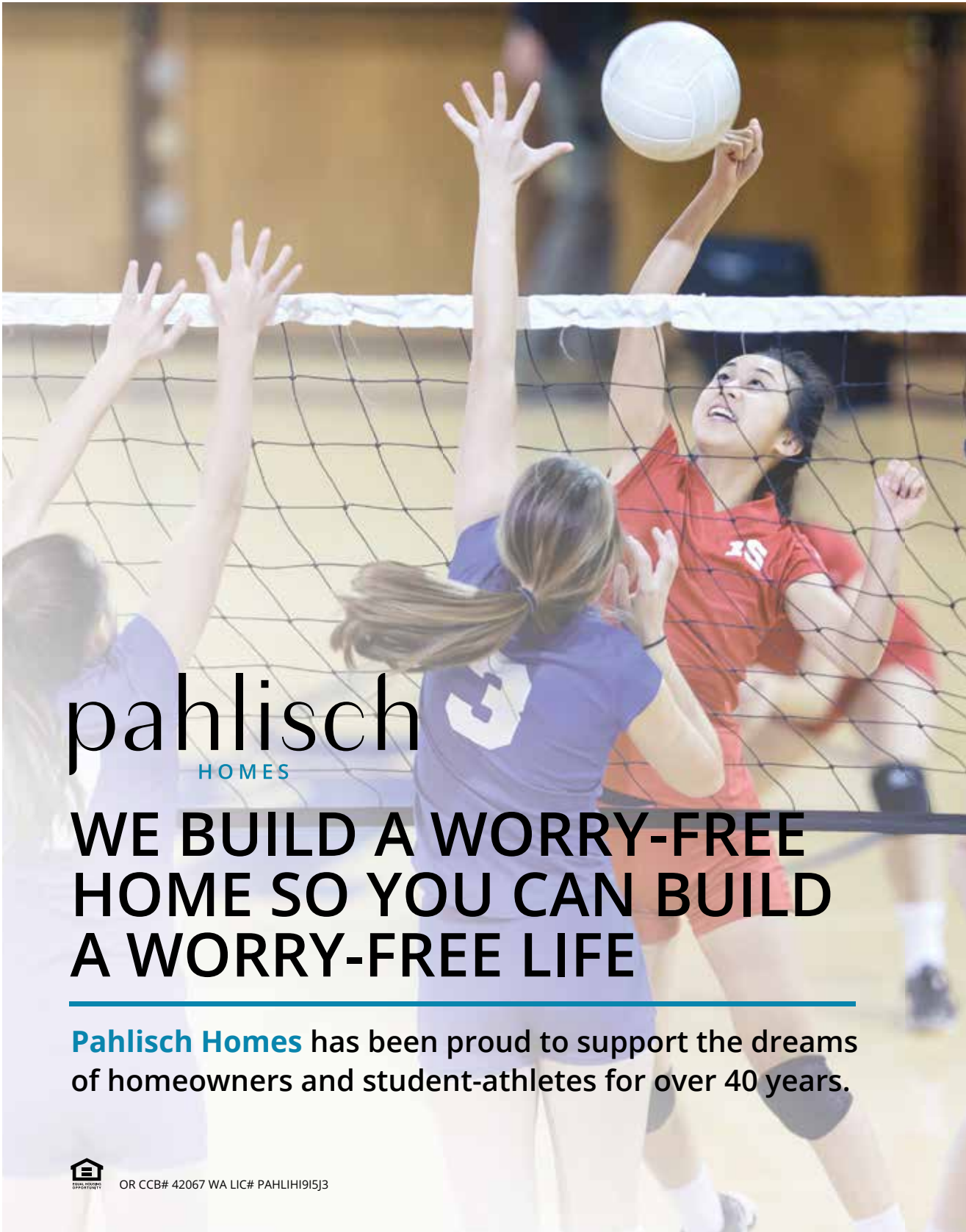
